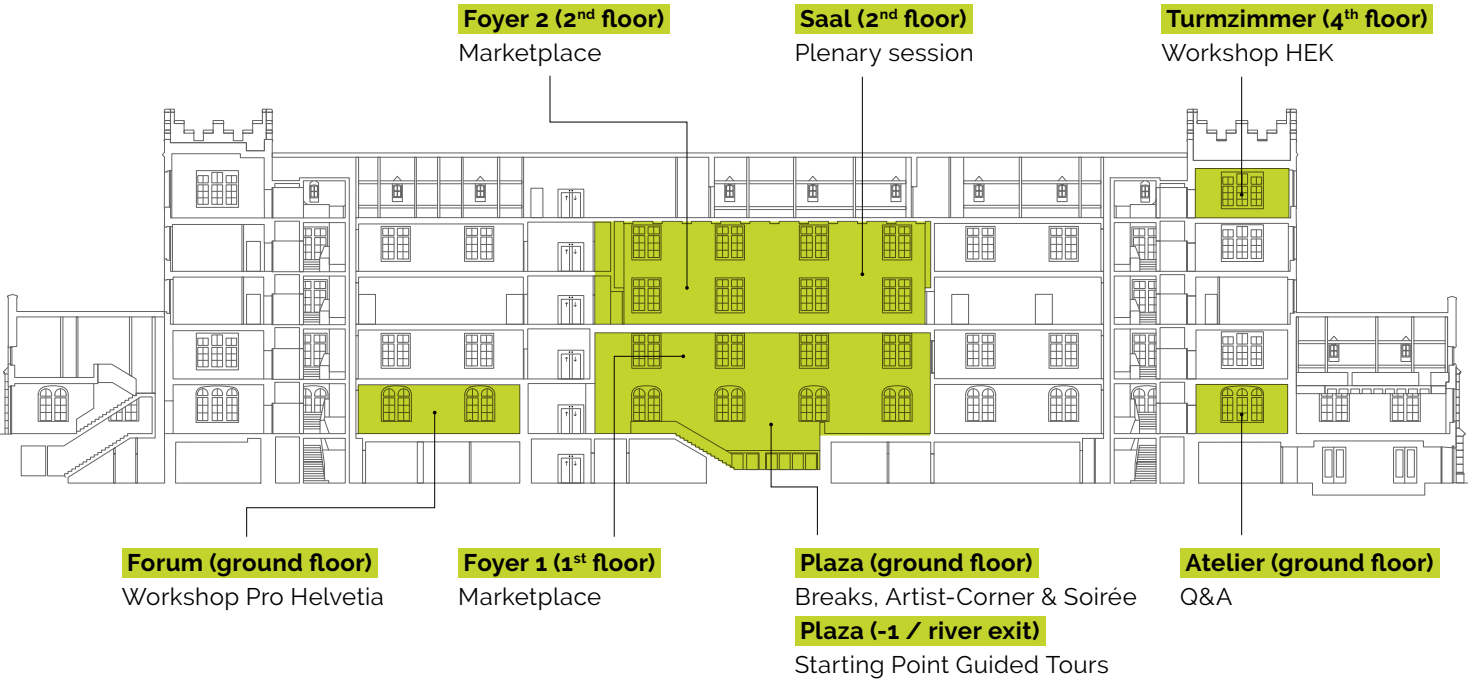
Culture meets AI: Three visions of the future (Suisseculture)
